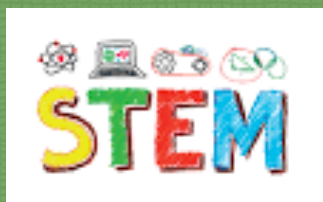


St Ninian's Primary
